Dear Parent or Carer,

Re: Confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Flint High School

NHS Wales Test, Trace, Protect trace everyone who have been in contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 (Coronavirus).

We have been working with TTP based on the following cases and are issuing an update regarding isolation dates (unless TTP has directly informed you otherwise; for example if your child is currently isolating as a positive case).

1. Confirmed case via PCR test within Year 12; Year 12 to remain in isolation. Normal activities can resume on 03/07/21 with a return to school on 05/07/21
2. Confirmed case via PCR test within Year 12 LLS Group; Year 12 LLS Group to remain in isolation. Normal activities can resume on 03/07/21 with a return to school on 05/07/21
3. A small group of students in Year 10 who are isolating from 23/06/21 as they have been identified as 'contacts'; this small group is to remain in isolation. Normal activities can resume on 03/07/21 with a return to school on 05/07/21
4. Confirmed case via PCR test within Year 8; Year 8 to remain in isolation. Normal activities and a return to school on 05/07/21
5. Confirmed case via PCR test within Year 10; Year 10 to remain in isolation. Normal activities resume and a return to school on 08/07/21 (with the exception of students in 3. Above)
6. A small number of students in Year 9 who are isolating from 28/06/21 as they have been identified as 'contacts'; this small group is to remain in isolation. Normal activities resume and a return to school on 08/07/21

We will advise on any date changes as we receive updates from the TTP service.

Self-isolation advice **requires your child to stay at home:**

- **Not to go outdoors to exercise, to visit shops, family or friends, or to other public spaces.**
- **Please do not invite people to your house or mix with others from your school. Your child must remain at home; however other household members are able to continue with their usual activities.**
- **Do not meet up with other members of the isolating bubble**
- **If at any point someone in the household becomes symptomatic, then the whole household should isolate. At this point, a test should be booked for the person with symptoms.**

If your child is still well at the end of the self-isolation period, and no other household member is symptomatic, they can return to their usual activities.

To reduce the risk of COVID-19 spreading, there are things that everyone in your family can do to help. These include:

- washing hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- using hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- washing hands as soon as they get home
- covering their mouth and nose with a tissue or sleeve (not their hands) when they cough or sneeze
- putting used tissues in the bin immediately and washing hands afterwards

Please be **alert for symptoms of COVID-19 in your child**, which are:

- A new or continuous cough
- A high temperature
- A loss of or change to sense of smell or taste

If your child develops any of these symptoms, even if they are mild:

- Book a test for them by phoning 119 or through the online portal: <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test>
- Inform the School that they are unwell with COVID-19 symptoms and that you have requested a test
- Your child should remain in self-isolation
- All other household members should isolate for 10 days from when your child developed symptoms
- Do not visit a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital but if you require medical advice please contact NHS 111 or telephone your GP; if there is a medical emergency phone 999



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- If you require medical advice for COVID-19 symptoms or another reason, please inform the healthcare worker that your child is a contact of a case of COVID-19 and in self-isolation
- Please follow the advice provided when your child receives their test result
